

Lesson 2 - Biography- Part I

A biography is built out of a couple of elements that according to what purpose, is reconstructed. Our biography is build up from this principle. We have:

- Facts
- A Story
- Flavours
- Impression makers

The facts are there; we cannot change, if you tell it to someone, you'll have a story. Flavours are the unique things you've experienced, like for example having had the chance to work with a famous conductor. Impression makers are facts that could impress other people. Maybe you've performed in an important hall or place, or you were able to win an exceptional prize.

So what are we going to do? We're building first the base for your biography.
