

# Recordings with Orchestra Manhattan Conducted by David Wroe

## **Pricing**

Commercial recording/distribution on Cicerone Music and Arts (CiMA) label <u>add-on.</u>
<u>OPTIONAL.</u> ONLY available with Orchestra Manhattan conducted by David Wroe:

- Concertos and Arias suitable for chamber orchestra (see below the standard orchestration)
- Orchestral works by living composers for chamber orchestra (see below the standard orchestration)
- Cost per minute of the piece's duration: \$475/min

- Additional musicians can be requested for works which require larger ensembles.
   Inquire for pricing
- Recording/rehearsal ratio included: up to 4:1 depending on complexity. Higher ratio involves additional costs. The Orchestra's Music Director makes final decisions regarding additional time required for rehearsing/recording a specific piece.
- Recording/rehearsal ratio is the time allocated for each piece in the recording session. For example: a ratio of 4:1 means that a 10-minute piece will be rehearsed and recorded within a 40-minutes allotment.
- Alternatively, the recording session may be booked at \$6,000/hour. Can book/add time to individual sessions at 15-min increments, for \$1,600 per increment.
- Minimum recording session booking time: the length of the piece x 4. Nonstandard repertory may require additional time.
- Each movement must be recorded as a single track, no splicing in the middle of a
  movement is included in the price. Advanced splicing can be requested at
  additional cost for editing: \$60 per splice. Please NOTE: some edits may not be
  practical to make.

Recordings are mastered, published, distributed on digital audio platforms by <u>Cicerone Music and Arts (CiMA)</u>, a publisher label in Switzerland/Italy, as part of an audio Album, with 10-year distribution and basic promotion management included. Booster promotional packages for individual tracks are available by separate arrangement with CiMA starting at \$400/month

- Chamber Ensemble
- For Composers new string quartet performance and recording for an Album.

- Opera Scenes for vocalists
- Conductors orchestral works or accompaniment options
- Large Ensembles (up to 20 members)

**Included in the Carnegie Gala Concert Package:** 

#### Archival video of your complete performance recorded live from Carnegie Hall\* delivered within 6-8 weeks after the concert

\*Certain restrictions for use of Carnegie Hall Archival Video apply \*you are permitted to display the video on your own website and on your professional management's website; you may share video with your contacts via emails, including emailing campaigns; you may include it in grant applications, your promotion portfolios and other materials designed for career advancement and shared directly with recipients. You may not monetize the video or any portion of it; you may not place the video on commercial monetizable platforms such as YouTube, Facebook, LinkedIn, even if your channel is a non-profit and does not conduct monetizable activity; you may not place the video on platforms which sell access to videos, video courses, etc.; you may not modify/edit the video, nor extract the audio for a separate use; you may not remove the banner on the lower third of the video; you may not tamper with the video's metadata in any way.

#### Costs\*:

- Solo: \$1,500 for 5 min\*. Additional minutes \$250
- Orchestra: \$3,000 for up to 7 min\*. Additional minutes \$350/min. <u>Includes</u>
   <u>rehearsal(s)</u> with the orchestra. Complete Concertos and/or single movements of
   a Concerto and/or Concert pieces acceptable. Arias, operatic scenes, and other
   vocal works are acceptable.

Costs include a sound check at Carnegie Hall on the day of the concert. Each artist/group is allotted time on stage for soundcheck proportional to the length of their program.

\*Fees are billed based on the best estimate of stage time required for each segment. After the concert, a final invoice will be sent reflecting the <u>actual time on stage</u>, based on the duration of the video recording from the concert. Final

invoice may include a refund of overpayment (if the actual stage time was shorter than the estimate), or a charge for additional stage time (if stage time was longer than the original estimate).

\*Additional Stage Minutes for walk on/off stage and acknowledgment of composer - \$250/min
